THE FRIENDS OF HONITON STATION

There has been a railway running through Honiton since 1860. In its heyday the line was part of a route that took passengers from London to Plymouth and to the holiday resorts of North Devon and North Cornwall.

By the 1960s, however, it seemed to be in decline, with services run down, the line beyond Exeter closing and many of its branch lines shut down. The future seemed to be one of managed neglect and eventual closure. Long stretches of the line were reduced to single track and historic station buildings knocked down.

However, this is a railway that simply refused to lie down and die. After a long campaign, a key section of double track was reinstated through Axminster nearly 15 years ago, allowing what had become a two-hourly service to return to a more acceptable hourly one. Almost overnight passenger numbers doubled, and have continued to increase since then.

And yet the potential for more is prevented by the remaining long sections of single track, which mean that one train an hour in each direction is all that is possible.

But it need not be like this. South Western Railway, Network Rail, MPs and local councils, as well as passenger groups like ourselves, are unanimous that the way forward is for two trains an hour to operate between Axminster, Honiton and Exeter. But to achieve this, we need the reinstatement of double track between Honiton and just outside Feniton, and from west of Whimple to the M5 bridge near Pinhoe.

With all the new housing at Axminster and Honiton, at Cranbrook and around Pinhoe, there is no doubt that the passengers will be there. A detailed plan has been written by a group led by Network Rail. Everyone is now campaigning hard to get the Government to agree the funding needed to carry out the track and signalling work required.

The railway line through East Devon has a fantastic future. Or it will

do, if we can secure the improvements needed to return the line to something like railway we once had, before Dr. Beeching got his hands on it.

A short winter walk at East Hill - with a marvellous pay-off; the fantastic views over Sidmouth and Exmouth at Fire Beacon Hill!

This walk starts near Putts Corner on the Honiton – Sidmouth Road, Turn down beside The Hare and Hounds towards Ottery St Mary. Then just at the top of the hill turn left at Chineway Head. Follow this lane right to the end, and find the Forestry Commission carpark at White Cross and Fire Beacon. There are no charges for parking here. There seem to be numerous pathways leading in and out of the woods, and a clearly defined, solid-surfaced "droveroad". We took the lefthand branch of the "drove-road" which is a solid track and followed it, soon with farmland on the left and woodlands continuing on the right. There is evidence of farm traffic through here, so look out for heavy farm machinery. We dropped through a dip, and as you rise up the other side, bear left at the fork. This is glorious woodland mainly beech trees, so expect a riot of colour, particularly in the autumn. We continued until the lane dropped away, and then turned right along a pathway signed Fire Beacon Hill, onto



the beacon and heathland. (Continuing down the hill brings you eventually to the main road near Waitrose at Sidmouth)

As soon as you emerge from the trees the panorama appears, almost at your feet! Straight ahead is Sidmouth and the English Channel. Continue with the drop on your left and spot The Bowd Inn, and donkeys in the fields closer in. As you continue, the vista opens out and Exmouth and the Exe Estuary become visible, with Berry Head in the far distance.

After the THIRD seat overlooking the valley, turn right inland to the "trigpoint". Pass this, and soon turn right onto another path, then left handed back into the trees. Following the finger posts soon brings you back to the original drove.

Turn left and retrace your steps to the carpark.

DISTANCE? 2 miles **DURATION?** Around 65 minutes.

O.S . MAP? Not necessary.

DOGS? Welcome but always under control.

DIFFICULTY? Easy/moderate. This is largely level walking, with a firm solid surface, so mobility scooter users may be able to access some of the route.



For the first time in over 2 years we all hope, and look forward to a Christmas "untainted" with Covid; a festive season without isolation from lockdowns; nor tears from tiers or fears from new variants! However, our endurances last year and the year before could be put into perspective if looking back to Victorian Christmas' in Honiton.

At a time before the welfare state many would spend yuletide in the poorhouse or worse, yet whilst times may have been tougher back then there were still charities and people who tried to make it as enjoyable for those less fortunate.

Those who were in the Honiton Union workhouse is one example: throughout the establishment's minute books there are references to kind gestures and mentions of gifts given to the inmates. A Miss Susan Venn entertained the inmates of the workhouse for "tea" in April 1892 as she was unable to provide a Christmas tree in December due to an influenza outbreak. Miss Venn did similar in February 1886 when she arranged for a Christmas tree to be erected, and presents given to the workhouse children. Many of the town's ladies



who "possibly could" attended the event for what is said to have been "a pleasant evening". Miss Venn had transferred the tree from the town's "ragged school" where she had offered a similar "treat" at the end of January of the same year.

A Mr. Edmunds and others distributed gifts to the 317 paupers at the workhouse for Christmas and New Year 1891 and other people of the town were also noted to have donated items such as 'cuffs for the children' and 'rabbits' for eating. The alms receivers were also given about 12 shillings each at Christmas as well as extra monies in case of sickness. There were also many bequests, made by a variety of different people, that were used to setup local Honiton charities, including a 18th century gift left by Richard Minifie, which was distributed on 21st June and at Christmas. Elizabeth Harris left a sum of £50, in 1782, so that bread could

be given to the poor on Christmas Day.

During the recession of the 1930s, hundreds of unemployed queued for their bread rations; in 1957 only 30 old people were given a loaf but by 1962 the interest on the original \pounds 50 could only provide 24 loaves however, other benefactors made it possible for each caller to be given a loaf, a shilling and an orange for the Christmas festivities! Many of these smaller charities still exist today as the amalgamated Honiton United Charities and still provide help and support to those in need around the town.

King's representative for the county of Devon, symbolically turned the soil as a silver birch was planted. Lady Clifford said: "It is a huge honour and privilege as a Devonian to join you for your anniversary and to celebrate the welcome and safe haven given by Honiton to those who were forced to flee a tyrant." Following the tree planting ceremony, a plaque was unveiled on the wall of Blackdown House also commemorating the important event in Honiton's history and acknowledging with 'gratitude the welcome, help and support from local residents, the council and voluntary groups'.

The second part of the day's programme took place at the Beehive. Compere, Jay Jina invited the guest speakers to say a few brief words, with all echoing the same sentiment that "Honiton had been a beacon of light in the darkness" for many British Asian families fleeing from President Idi Amin and his 'militia men'. Most had been given 90 days to leave but civil servants living in the northern district of Kampala were only given 48 hours notice. In Britain, the part played by 63 voluntary organisations, who had worked together with the Ugandan Resettlement Board, was an 'extraordinary achievement'. Film clips were shown of the arrival at Honiton camp, departure from Honiton Railway Station and 2022 interviews.

Entertainment was provided by students from the University of Exeter, with an opening dance from Swati Gola, there were also Indian dances from Arundhati and Arundhati and Company who closed the show with Bhangra, a traditional folk dance from the Punjab region of India. A poem written by Jay Jina gave an understanding of how the experience had been for Ugandan Asians arriving in Devon. Malaika, a song often heard on Ugandan radio at that time, was sung by university student Sachin and there was African drumming and dance by Shuma Dance.

A 50th anniversary cake was ceremoniously cut by Munira and Riyaz, girl and boy cousins born at Marlpits Hospital on December 8th and 28th December 1972. The day ended with a buffet of Indian savouries and a Devon cream tea. East Devon District Council were thanked for their "unstinting support in making the day's celebration possible." Thanks were extended to Allhallows Museum, the Thelma Hulbert Gallery, British Ugandan Asians At 50, Wendy and volunteers at the Beehive, students Dominic Case and Charlie Forbes and Mahendra Dabhi, Margaret Lewis BEM, Steve Parsons, Bina Pepper, Ana Collingridge, Rob Waldron, Mukesh Makecha and Manoj Chitnavis – BUA50@ Honiton.

A day of civic ceremony and celebration to mark the 50th anniversary of British Ugandan Asians' arrival at Heathfield Resettlement Camp in Honiton, took place on Saturday 29th October. The event was organised by the BUA50 at Honiton planning committee, in partnership with East Devon District Council. Chair of EDDC, Councillor Ian Thomas welcomed everyone to the district council's headquarters at Blackdown House on Heathpark. In his opening speech, Councillor Thomas said: "During October 1972, around 1,800 people experienced Britain for the first time where we stand today. 680 beds were swiftly assembled, huts cleaned, classrooms set up and teachers recruited to

<u>Dunkeswell Abbey, dating</u> <u>from the 13th century,</u> <u>is situated in a quiet valley</u> <u>about 2 miles north of</u> <u>Dunkeswell village.</u>

The abbey was founded in 1201 as a Cisterian Monastry, and a "satellite" of Forde Abbey, which is a few miles away on the Dorset/Somerset border. Dunkeswell Abbey grew in size and importance, and at one stage the buildings covered 6 acres with nearby trout ponds, woods and agricultural activities to supply the monks.

The abbey was closed in 1539, following the dissolution of the monasteries, and most of the building demolished soon afterwards, with the materials being taken for re-use in other nearby properties.

Now, surrounded by a small community of cottages and farms, this is a very tranquil place to visit. We had a sunny afternoon to explore the ruins, and see the towering remains of some of the original buildings, with other parts clearly absorbed by an adjoining farm. Near the site of the original cloisters stands the parish Church of The Holy Trinity, built in the mid 19th Century by the Simcoe family. This wonderfully plain church with a surprisingly large number of pews gives tribute to the former importance of this community, and place for work, meditation and worship.

Entry is free, but donations are welcome. November 2022.
